- II. The corporate and special purpose taxes extended or abated for 2006 were \$2,293,961.00.
- The proposed corporate and special purpose taxes to be levied for 2007 are \$2,458,655.00.
- This represents a 7.18% increase over the previous year.
- III. The property taxes extended for the debt services and public building commission leases for 2006 were \$387,628.00.
- The estimated property taxes to be levied for debt service and public building commission leases for 2007 are \$448,700.00.
- This represents a 15.76% increase over the previous year.
- IV. The total property taxes extended or abated for 2006 were \$2,681,589.00.
- The estimated total property taxes extended or abated for 2007 are \$2,907,355.00.
- This represents an 8.42% increase over the previous year.
