

NOTICE OF PROPOSED PROPERTY TAX INCREASE

FOR RANTOUL TOWNSHIP HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT 193

A public hearing to approve a proposed property tax levy increase for the Rantoul Township High School District 193 for 2006 will be held on December 11, 2006 at 6:45 p.m. at the Rantoul Township High School Board Room, 200 S. Sheldon Street, Rantoul, IL 61866.

Any person desiring to appear at the public hearing and present testimony to the taxing district may contact David L. Requa, Superintendent, 200 S. Sheldon Street, Rantoul, IL 61866 (217) 892-2151.

II. The corporate and special purpose property taxes extended or abated for 2005 were \$3,640,904.86.

The proposed corporate and special purposes property taxes to be levied for 2006 are \$4,290,000.00. This represents a 17.8% increase over the previous year.

III. The property taxes extended for debt service and public building commission leases for 2005 were \$312,955.63.

The estimate property taxes to be levied for debt service and public building commission leases for 2006 are \$313,000.00. This represents a .01% increase from the previous year.

IV. The total property taxes extended or abated for 2005 are \$3,953,860.49. The estimated total property taxes to be levied for 2006 are \$4,603,000.00. This represents a 16.4% increase over the previous year.
