WHEREAS, St. Joseph-Ogden CHSD #305, Champaign County and Vermilion County, Illinois, has ascertained and determined and does hereby ascertain and determine that the sum of \$1,300,000 must be raised for educational purposes; the sum of \$360,000 must be raised for operations and maintenance purposes; the sum of \$180,000 must be raised for transportation purposes; the sum of \$75,000 must be raised for working cash purposes; the sum of \$35,000 must be raised for municipal retirement purposes; the sum of \$35,000 must be raised for social security purposes; the sum of \$100,000 must be raised for tort immunity purposes; the sum of \$34,000 must be raised for special education purposes; the sum of \$75,000 must be raised for Health and Life Safety purposes; and the sum of \$30,000 must be raised for technology purposes.

**TRUTH IN TAXATION HEARING**  
**NOTICE OF PROPOSED PROPERTY TAX INCREASE**  
**FOR ST. JOSEPH-OGDEN C.H.S.D. #305**

- I. A public hearing to approve a proposed property tax levy increase for St. Joseph-Ogden C.H.S.D. #305 for 2005 will be held on Monday, November 27, 2006, at 6:45 P.M. at St. Joseph-Ogden High School in the Board of Education Room.

Any person desiring to appear at the public hearing and present testimony to the taxing district may contact Dr. Victor E. Zimmerman, Superintendent, St. Joseph-Ogden District. #305, St. Joseph, IL 61873.

- II. The corporate and special purpose property taxes extended for 2005 were \$1,997,898. The proposed corporate and special purpose property taxes to be levied for 2006 are \$2,224,000. This represents an increase of 11.3% over the previous year.
- III. The property tax extended for debt service for 2005 was \$319,101. The estimated total property tax to be levied for debt service for 2006 is \$592,076. This represents an increase of 85.5% over the previous year.
- IV. The total property taxes extended or abated for 2005 were \$2,316,999. The estimated total property taxes to be levied for 2006 are \$2,816,076. This represents an increase of 21.5% over the previous year.
