Ordinance No. 2006-06

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LEVYING, ASSESSMENT AND COLLECTION OF TAXES FOR THE YEAR 2006 OF THE URBANA PARK DISTRICT, CHAMPAIGN COUNTY, ILLINOIS.

Be it ordained by the Urbana Park District Board of Commissioners, Urbana, Illinois.

Section 1. That a tax in the sum of Three Million Four Hundred Forty Seven Thousand Nine Hundred Thirty Five Dollars (\$3,447,935) or as much thereof as may be authorized by law, to defray all expenses and liabilities for all corporate purposes, for the purpose of planning, establishing and maintaining recreational programs, for participation in the Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund, for purposes of audit expense, for liability insurance expense, for social security expense, for police services expense, for museum expense and for handicap tax fund, be, and the same hereby is levied on all taxable property within the Urbana Park District subject to taxation in the current tax year, and in the amounts so required or hereafter itemized as follows:







NOTICE OF PROPOSED PROPERTY TAX INCREASE FOR URBANA PARK DISTRICT

- I.** A public hearing to approve a proposed property tax levy increase for Urbana Park District for 2006 will be held on December 12, 2006 at 7:30 p.m. at the Anita Purves Nature Center, 1505 N. Broadway, Urbana, Illinois.

Any person desiring to appear at the public hearing and present testimony to the taxing district may contact Vicki J. Mayes, Executive Director, 303 W. University Avenue, Urbana, Illinois; 217.367.1536.

- II.** The corporate and special purpose property taxes extended or abated for 2005 were \$2,728,852.

The proposed corporate and special purpose property taxes to be levied for 2006 are \$3,447,935. This represents a 26.35% increase over the previous year.

- III.** The property taxes extended for debt service and public building commission leases for 2005 were \$712,849.

The estimated property taxes to be levied for debt service and public building commission leases for 2006 are \$714,490. This represents a 00.23% increase over the previous year.

- IV.** The total property taxes extended or abated for 2005 were \$3,441,701.

The estimated total property taxes to be levied for 2006 are \$4,162,425. This represents a 20.94% increase over the previous year.

get it on you, and then use some alcohol to get it thoroughly off," Miller said. "And for gosh sakes, don't put your fingers anywhere near your face unless you're sure the sap is all gone."

One final suggestion: "Don't be afraid of (the) Latin names of plants. The only way the doctors knew what to do for me was to Google the name of the plant and see what it could do to me, then research the proper treatment."

Photoperiodism influences many activities in plants, including growth, seed germination, flowering, fruit development and the onset of winter dormancy. Some plants need a specific period of daylight or night length to initiate flowering.

The time required can vary among plant species and plant varieties. Some plants require a specific light/dark period to flower or with some plants a change in light /dark period can hasten flowering but is not required.

In plants referred to as "short day," their flower bud formation begins when daylight is relatively short —

earlier in the year to get the correct timing. If a plant isn't flowering well for you, include its photoperiod requirement on the list of suspects.

I must be a long day gardener. I think I will pull up a lawn chair under the grow lights in my basement and wait for spring to shine.

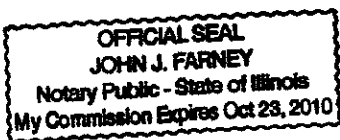
